UPCOMING 2 DAY TRAINING JULY 13th & JULY 14th:

Foster Families/ Relative Care Providers & How they Grow:

Understanding the Effects of Fostering

This is an upcoming 6 hour workshop designed for licensed foster/ relative care providers in the early stages of fostering (first 5 years) or have been fostering for a while with few placements. Although it is designed for the first stages of foster/ relative care, this training is certainly open up to all homes that may need a refresher on these skills.

The following issues unique to fostering/ relative care will be discussed:

- **Understanding & dealing with the new set of challenges;**
- **Understanding the new emerging roles & barriers to fulfilling those roles;**
- **Recognizing the stages of adjustment & changing family relationships for everyone touched by the fostering/ kinship experiences;**
- **Identifying stresses & develop strategies to build a healthy fostering/ kinship experience.**

This is a 6 hour workshop being offered by La Crosse County Human Services that will be trained by foster parent Suanne Kraft; Alternate care worker Richelle Zimmerman & the Relative care social worker Lila Barlow. This will be offered over the course of 2 evenings. Participants that sign up must be able to commit to both evenings in order to sign up for this course.

This course is being offered on Tuesday July 13th 5:30 Pm – 8:30 PM & Wednesday July 14th 5:30 PM to 8:30 PM. The location for both evenings will be in the Administration Center basement Auditorium. *6 Fun in the Sun! Day Program

WHO: All students who reside in La Crosse County are eligible for the program. We are looking for students from 5th to 8th grade, but can be flexible with the ages if needed. We are looking for a maximum of 10 students, so we are asking that the students will be *interested* in the program, have a *positive attitude*, and are aware that they need to have *good behavior* in order to participate.

The program will be staffed by two young adults, who both currently attend the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse and have different backgrounds in working with children and education.

WHAT: "Fun in the Sun!" is a summer program for kids provided by La Crosse County UW Extension. The program has been in place since 2006. It is designed to provide children with fun, **free** summer activities. In addition, the program provides supervision, teaches students important social skills, as well as gets students to meet new people.

WHEN: The program meets from Wednesday, July 7th to Wednesday August 18th. Typically the program will be Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays. We will be meeting for either a full day (9am-3pm) or a half day (9am-12pm) depending on the activity. Times may also change as well and a schedule of events will be sent home, along with permission slips and additional information.

WHERE: Depending on where the students live, we will designate 2 drop off/pick up spots for students to meet and to be picked up. The program will be responsible for transporting the students from the points to and from the activities. Some of the activities in the past have included swimming at local pools, horseback riding, educational activities, canoeing, tubing, visiting caves, fishing, etc. We are also planning a bigger, end of the year activity in which we will go to a water park in WI Dells (likely Noah's Ark) and camp overnight. **If students in the program are unable to demonstrate good behavior during the program, they will be unable to attend the final activity to the Dells.

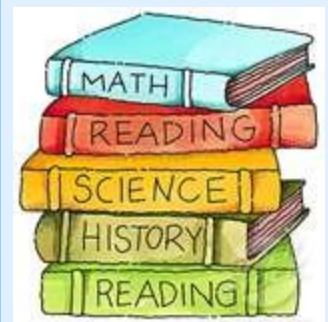
