Pharmaceuticals Drop-Off

The Household Hazardous Materials (HHM) site still accepts most unwanted pharmaceuticals and over-the-counter medications.

Because of regulations, the HHM site can no longer accept pharmaceuticals regulated as controlled substances. These include

- prescription painkillers
- stimulants
- strong sedatives
- muscle relaxants
- steroids
- codeine

Special collection events to collect all unwanted pharmaceuticals **including controlled substances** will be held on four dates in 2012:

February 18; spring, summer, and fall collection dates will be advertised.

All e-waste is sent to a recycler that is registered with the Wisconsin DNR.

E-Waste Recycling

Electronics are BANNED from disposal in Wisconsin landfills or incinerators—they MUST be recycled. For more information on recycling electronic waste in Wisconsin, visit <http://dnr.wi.gov/org/aw/wm/ecycle/index.htm>

- Stereos
- Fax machines
- Disk drives
- Telephones
- Microwaves
- Copiers
- Circuit boards
- Cameras
- CB and ham radios
- Computer monitors
- VCRs/DVD players
- Computer gaming items
- CPUs
- Laptops
- Cable/satellite TV equipment

Not accepted: dehumidifiers, air conditioners, anything with coolant or Freon

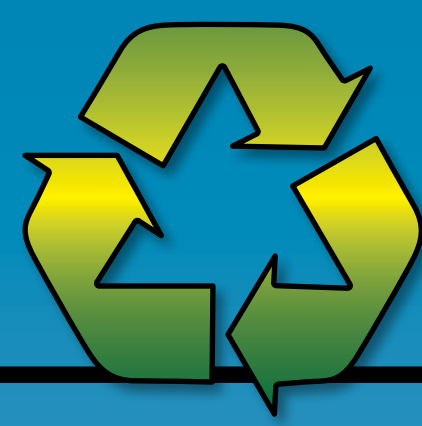
What Are the Environmental Benefits of Reusing and Recycling E-Waste?

Electronic products are made from valuable resources, such as precious and other metals, plastics, and glass, all of which require energy to mine and manufacture. Reusing and recycling these materials from end-of-life electronics conserves our natural resources and avoids air and water pollution caused by mining and the manufacturing new products.

For example:

- Recycling one million laptops saves the energy equivalent to the electricity used by 3,657 U.S. homes in a year.
- One ton of circuit boards can contain 40 to 800 times the amount of gold and 30 to 40 times the amount of copper mined from one ton of ore in the United States.
- By recycling 100 million cell phones, 3.4 tons of gold is recovered.

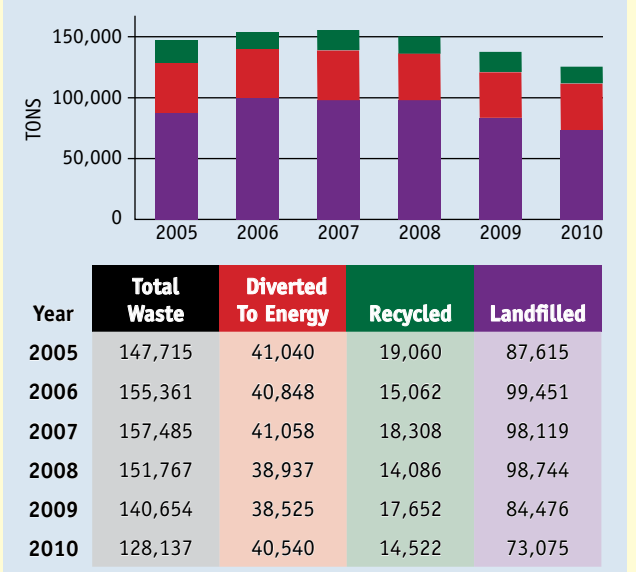

Public Use of County Landfill

La Crosse County's easily accessible public drop-off site at 6500 Highway 16 is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM. We accept waste from homeowners, renters, and businesses located around the region. There are eight numbered and labeled containers so that you can separate your waste appropriately. Disposal fees are 5¢ per pound, payable at the site (minimum \$2). Your vehicle will be weighed upon entering and leaving the landfill site to determine cost. There is a 3% convenience fee (minimum \$2 per transaction) for the use of credit or debit cards. **You must stop at the scale to be weighed, and you must provide your own labor.**



Waste Diversion Rates



The above graph illustrates the disposal and diversion of waste within the La Crosse County system. This includes all the waste sent to the Xcel Energy plant and the La Crosse County Landfill, but excludes the waste recycled curbside. In 2010 over 74,000 tons of waste was sent to Xcel and over 86,000 tons to the landfill. The Solid Waste Department and Xcel Energy helped reduce the amount of waste going into the landfill by diverting this valuable resource into either energy production or recycling programs.

Some of these programs include converting used shingles from a waste product into material that can be used in reducing the amount of asphalt for roads. Clean wood waste is ground up and sold to Xcel Energy to produce energy, and waste concrete is crushed and used for other applications including a replacement for gravel on roads. Other wastes that are recycled include tires, scrap metal, yard waste, and cardboard.

Because of these successful diversion programs over 42 percent of all waste sent into the solid waste system in 2010 was recycled or reused. This reduces the impact of these wastes on our environment because they become a resource instead of a waste; this will also help keep our existing landfill space available for many more years, eliminating the need to locate another landfill within our region.

What Can Be Dropped Off?

Large Items: Furniture and furnishings including upholstered items, general household waste, toys, bikes, grills, lawnmowers (without gas and oil), mattresses, stoves, hot water heaters, washers, dryers, small appliances, etc.

Clothing & Shoes

Demolition/Construction Debris: Wood, drywall, doors, windows, sinks, toilets, tubs, roofing, bricks, carpets, tile, flooring.

Garbage: Normal household waste like bagged waste, paper, and food waste. Place in the Xcel waste-to-energy bin.

Other: Yard waste/grass clippings, shingles, brush, and animal carcasses.

Tires: May be dropped off for a higher fee.

What Cannot Be Dropped Off?

Hazardous waste, propane tanks, dehumidifiers, refrigerators, air conditioners, and anything else with Freon or coolant cannot be accepted.

No Salvaging

Only people authorized by site attendants may use the facility. Security cameras are in use, and violators will be referred to law enforcement.

La Crosse County Sharps Collection Program

Household generated "sharps" are accepted at the La Crosse County Hazardous Materials Facility FREE of charge from La Crosse County residents. (Business and out-of-county generated sharps are accepted by appointment and for a fee.)

Never place loose sharps in the garbage.

The following sharps are accepted:

- Needles
- Syringes
- Lancets
- Test strips
- PICC lines

Procedure:

- Place the sharps in puncture resistant containers (either a registered red sharps container or a thick plastic container such as a laundry detergent or bleach bottle).

NOTE: If the sharps are in a container other than the two listed above, they will not be accepted.

- Label the container "SHARPS" and lock the lid.
- Bring the container to the Household Hazardous Materials Facility.

Because loose sharps are dangerous, a HHM technician cannot remove sharps from a container.



Green Tier

The La Crosse County Solid Waste Department became Wisconsin's first publicly owned solid waste disposal system to join the state's Green Tier program. This program encourages participants to voluntarily collaborate with the state Department of Natural Resources to go beyond compliance with regulations and to achieve superior environmental performance. The result is that over 40 percent of the waste delivered to the La Crosse County System does not go into the landfill. This waste is diverted to a recycling program or to Xcel to produce electricity.

Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Cathy Stepp congratulated County officials for their foresight. "I never imagined I could be so impressed with a landfill operation," Stepp said. "The extent of your recycling programs is amazing, and you have found two different ways to turn waste into energy. It's wonderful to think you will be turning landfill gas into a source of heat and energy for a medical complex. We are very proud of your accomplishments."

Curbside Brush Chipping, Yard Waste Disposal, Burning, Large Article Curbside Service, White Goods Curbside Service

Curbside Brush Chipping (▲ on calendar)

Note that brush is not accepted at the Town compost site. VIOLATORS will be ticketed!

The purpose of the chipping program is to help residents with brush that accumulates at their residence due to spring cleanup and/or damage done by wind, etc.

Dates: Brush will be chipped at your residence on the **second Tuesday of the month April through October**. The dates for 2012 are as follows: April 10, May 8, June 12, July 10, August 14, September 11, and October 9.

Sign up for chipping: Contact the Town Hall (526-3354) and furnish your name, address, and phone number to be placed on the brush chipping list. **YOU MUST CALL THE TOWN HALL NO LATER THAN NOON ON THE MONDAY BEFORE THE SECOND TUESDAY.**

Acceptable materials: Brush and small trees (up to and including 6 inches in diameter) are acceptable. It may not be piled higher than 3 feet.

Small twigs: Twigs shorter than 24 inches and less than 3/4 inch thick should be disposed with your regular yard waste (see "Yard Waste, Leaves & Grass").

Unacceptable materials: **The brush service is not for tree removal.** The Town service is not to be used to clear "woods" around a home, remove large trees or to clear building sites. If there is a large amount of brush, it will NOT be picked up. (A tree service can assist you with disposal of lot clearings, etc.)

Preparation: Pile with cut ends toward the road. Be sure that branches and trees are free of metal, wire, rope, tinsel, plastic, stones, and other debris that could damage the chipper.

Yard Waste, Leaves & Grass

You may bring leaves, grass clippings, sod, wood chips and other yard or garden waste to the disposal site just to the west of the cell tower by the Town Hall (at the bottom of the U-driveway). These materials may be left at any time during daylight hours. A garbage can is provided for the disposal of bags brought to the site. This area is for your convenience; please do not abuse it by leaving household trash or other unacceptable materials. Anyone is welcome to take compost soil and wood chips from the site.

PLEASE—no brush, branches or limbs are accepted at the compost site (violators will be ticketed).

Christmas Trees

Christmas trees may be brought to the Town Hall parking lot (by the cell tower) through January 15. Please remove tinsel, ornaments, and tree bags.

Burning Ban

Burn barrels and burning leaves/refuse in backyards are not allowed in the Town of Holland.

The Town of Holland has an ordinance prohibiting open burning, outdoor burning and burning refuse. The ordinance is intended to promote the public health, safety and welfare and to safeguard the health, comfort, living conditions, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Town of Holland due to the air pollution and fire hazards of open burning, outdoor burning, and refuse burning.

Still allowed within the Township would be grilling or cooking outdoors, campfires, fire rings/pits, and outdoor wood stoves (as long as they are constructed to standards established in the ordinance) and other exceptions with a permit as provided by the Holmen Fire Department.

Large Article Curbside Service (□ on calendar)

For your convenience, large items will be picked up curbside by Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling. Large item collection dates will be the first Wednesday of the month starting in April and running through October (see calendar). Please note the purpose of the large article service is to assist homeowners in disposing of large items—it is not for large home clean-outs or large remodeling jobs. (To be fair to other taxpayers, you will be required to hire a disposal service or use the La Crosse County landfill service—see below.) NOTE: Hilltopper will be monitoring for any abuse of the system.

Sign up for service: Although there is no fee for this service, you must call Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling at 783-6727 (toll free 888-783-6727) in advance to have these items collected. You will need to list the items you will be placing curbside.

Acceptable items: scrap metal, furniture, mattresses, grills, bathroom fixtures, small amounts of lumber or similar waste and items over 4 feet in length or over 75 lbs.

Items NOT accepted:

- anything that fits in a trash bag (household waste which should be placed curbside)
- anything shorter than 4 feet in length or weighs less than 75 lbs.
- styrofoam packing material
- large amounts of demolition materials (if you are remodeling or create large amounts of demolition materials, it will be necessary to arrange dumpster service)
- hazardous waste including lawn/garden chemicals, gas tanks, sealed containers (see Household Hazardous Waste information)
- moving boxes (call Hilltopper 783-6727 for disposal of moving boxes)

Alternatives: If you are conducting a large clean-out or remodeling job (or if you prefer not to use the curbside service), you may:

- Call a disposal service and request a dumpster.
- Use La Crosse County's public drop off site at 6500 Highway 16. They are open Monday through Friday 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM (disposal fees are 5¢ per pound with a \$2 minimum).

White Goods & E-Waste (fees involved, fees subject to change)

White goods curbside service is available every Wednesday for the entire calendar year (not just the large article curbside service dates).

Appliances are collected on Wednesdays by appointment only. Call Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling at 783-6727 (toll free 888-873-6727). The per-item fee must be paid to Hilltopper prior to collection.

White goods picked up for \$20: refrigerators, washing machines, stoves, freezers, dryers, dishwashers, sump pumps, air conditioners, central heating/cooling units, heat pumps, street lamps, microwaves, copy machines, some electric motors, furnaces, dehumidifiers, water softeners, hot water heaters.

Other items picked up for a fee: camper refrigerators (\$50); computer equipment—call Hilltopper (783-6727) for pricing information.

Tires:

Car tires:	\$5.00 off the rim	\$7.50 on the rim
Truck tires:	\$10.00 off the rim	\$12.50 on the rim
Tractor tires:	\$15.00 off the rim	\$17.50 on the rim

Other options for white goods (not curbside options):

- Scientific Recycling at 659 Commerce Street, Holmen, 608-526-9777 (\$12 fee for most appliances. They will accept e-waste free except TVs).
- Runde Metal Recycling at 647 Commerce Street, Holmen, 608-526-9358. (They pay for most appliances. They do not take refrigerants, TVs, or e-waste.)

E-waste recycling: You may recycle e-waste for a small fee through Hilltopper. Please call for details. Acceptable items: printers, CPUs, fax machines, copiers, computer monitors, laptops, keyboards/mice, disk drives, circuit boards, computer accessories, telephones, cameras, VCR/DVD players, stereos, televisions, and more.

2012 Town of Holland Trash & Recycling Pickup Schedules

Curbside Trash Pickup Guidelines (● on calendar)

Trash pickup dates: Pickup service is on Mondays by Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling (783-6727) unless otherwise indicated on the schedule.

Preparing trash: Use clear plastic bags and place them at one location at the road's edge by 5:00 AM the day of pickup. (Refuse may be placed out the night before if this is more convenient.) Bags must be tied closed. Bags may be left in a can to avoid damage, but they must be tied closed.

If you are doing any major home improvements (new roof, new siding, etc.) or any major disposal of excess junk, you are required to rent your own dumpster for the waste material.

If your refuse is not picked up by the end of the day on Monday, please contact Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling immediately at 783-6727.

Curbside Recycling Pickup Guidelines (○ on calendar)

Recycling pickup dates: Pickup service is every Monday (see calendar below) by Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling (783-6727) unless otherwise indicated on the calendar. Please put recyclables in your red recycling bin and place it at the road's edge by 5:00 a.m. the day of pickup.

Preparing materials for recycling: See the chart below the calendar for preparation instructions.



Acceptable Trash

- Total weight of can or bag is 60 pounds or less.
- Empty, flattened and bundled cardboard boxes.
- Some lumber if less than 4 feet in length and bundled weighing not more than 50 pounds. Limit is 3 bundles per year.

Unacceptable Trash

- Anything over 4 feet in length. Items such as furniture, mattresses, TV sets, etc. should be disposed of through the use of "Large Article Curbside Service" (see details on page 2).
- Total weight of can or bag is over 60 pounds.
- Paint. Partially used cans can be taken to the Hazardous Materials Facility (see front page for details).
- Construction material (common items include roofing materials, bathtubs, shower enclosures, windows, sheet rock, brick, kitchen cabinets, etc.)
- Hazardous materials such as solvents, gasoline or other toxic, corrosive, explosive or highly combustible materials. Some of these items may be taken to the Household Hazardous Materials Facility (see front page for details).
- Vehicle parts and other metal weighing more than 10 pounds. Metals should be taken to a salvage yard. Tires, batteries, and most fluids can be disposed of at an automotive business. Some companies charge for disposal, so call in advance.
- Trash bags that contain recycling material. (See recycling instructions.) The waste hauler will tag the bag indicating the violation.

How to Prepare Recyclables

GLASS: Jars and bottles only! <ul style="list-style-type: none"> NO light bulbs, dishes, glassware, window glass, mirrors, or ceramics. Remove lids and metal rings, empty, and rinse clean. 	TIN CANS: Empty food, paint, aerosol cans only! <ul style="list-style-type: none"> NO chemicals, scrap metal, or vehicle parts. Empty, rinse clean, and remove labels. Ends of cans can stay attached.
